dences as well as respite care homes and retreat facilities, they offer programs and services to minister to people with special needs. They are dedicated to see those with special needs live out the fullest of lives. Spiritual life is an important part of this ministry.

June 24 - Community FoodShare (formerly Dundas County Food Bank) is a registered charity created to help fight hunger in our community. Community Food Share operates from two locations which are open three times a week and a food cupboard open one day a week. We serve over 350 families, representing more than 1,000 people, 40% of whom are children. Our programs are supported through generous donations from individuals, businesses, churches and service organizations in the community.

July 1 - Open Doors' vision is three-fold. First, their vision is to strengthen and equip the Body of Christ living under or facing restriction and persecution because of their faith in Jesus Christ, and to encourage their involvement in world evangelism by providing Bibles and literature, media, leadership training, socio-economic development and intercessory prayer. Second, it is their aim to prepare the Body of Christ living in threatened or unstable areas to face persecution and suffering. Third, their goal is to educate and mobilize the

Body of Christ living in the free world to identify with threatened and persecuted Christians and to be actively involved in assisting them.

July 8 - The Bible League In more than 40 countries worldwide, Bible League Canada partners with churches, indigenous Christian and community leaders, and local governments. Together with their faithful supporters, they are able to provide Bibles, training and resources for Christians who are working on the ground, delivering the Good News to those who have never heard it.

ANSWERS:

- 2) Since the 60's, Brasilia is the Capital of Brazil. Before that, Rio de Janeiro was the capital. Although the largest city in Brazil, Sao Paulo is the capital of a state that bears the same name. Buenos Aires is the capital of Argentina, a neighboring country.
- 3) Yes. The Republic of Suriname is the smallest country in South America, and it was a Dutch colony for many years. The Suriname Dutch is one of the main languages spoken there.
- 4) Samba and Soccer are the correct answers.
- 5) Brazil is the 5th largest country after Russia, Canada, United States and China. Thus, the correct answer is "b". Australia is 6th and India is 7th.
