October 7 - World Renew - General Fund

Compelled by God's passion for justice and mercy, World Renew (General Fund) joins communities around the world to renew hope, reconcile lives, and restore creation. World Renew responds to disasters in North America and in 27 developing countries. It works in 24 of these and other countries in sustainable transformation; it coordinates thousands of local and international volunteers; it encourages advocacy initiatives; and it helps build the capacity of impoverished communities by working with 76 faith-based and government organizations around the world. Last year, it touched the lives of 1.75 million people in more than 4,050 poor communities.

October 8 - Community Food Share (formerly Dundas County Food Bank) is a registered charity created to help fight hunger in our community. Community Food Share operates from two locations which are open three times a week and a food cupboard open one day a week. We serve over 350 families, representing more than 1,000 people, 40% of whom are children. Our programs are supported through generous donations from individuals, businesses, churches and service organizations in the community.

The Search Committee is visiting another potential pastor for our congregation this weekend and covets your prayers as they continue working diligently to find a full time pastor. In the meantime, Rev. Bernie Bakker has graciously accepted council's offer to work part time in serving our congregation by bringing God's Word to us on Sundays and making some pastoral visits.
