Have you ever had a childhood dream come true in the most unexpected of ways? I always thought that if I could go back in time, I would like to be a pioneer woman. I loved their dresses, hard-working attitudes, their ability to break ground on new frontiers, and the close community they had with those they worked and lived with in the wild west.

Well, a few weeks ago, a few of us fellow missionaries gathered together to pray for and encourage a colleague who was going through a very difficult time. And while we were talking, another friend mentioned that we are circling our wagons, gathering for prayer, willing to fight and defend each other, and sharing a meal. I pictured my covered-wagon and knew that God still let my dreams come true.

And how amazing it is to travel together in this journey of missions. One of the groups that I am banding together with is all the families that represent Global Outreach Mission in Uganda. It's exciting to be 5 families serving the Lord in various areas and capacities.

Another group that I get to join is the missionaries who serve in Soroti. On Thursday mornings most of us ladies try to get together for Bible study, encouragement, fellowship, and prayer, and that is truly rewarding.

The wagon train that I travel with the most is my small group from Sunday's Ladies Bible study. There are about 9 young Ugandan women who come to my home for intensive Bible study and leadership development. But beyond Sundays - we help each other in our various work places, we are accountable to each other (just a few minutes ago one of the young ladies called me to see if I went to the doctor's today for a check up... she knows I am stubborn), and we share life together. Earlier this week I was able to travel 5 hours north with one of the young ladies, to train church leaders on the new Lead Today youth discipleship curriculum.

And then, of course, I'm glad and grateful for my friends, family, donors, and prayer warriors who are on my band wagon train as well. I wouldn't be able to overcome hurdles, both personal and natural, without your help and encouragement. I shall continue being brave and adventurous for the Lord, planting seeds of hope and development in the lives around me here in Soroti.
